Proposed Procedures and Maternity Care Guidelines Ready for Review

In the spring of 2014, the Council of Academic Family Medicine (CAFM) formed two task forces to develop two sets of guidelines for family medicine residency programs: Maternity Care Guidelines and Procedures Guidelines.

The AFMRD took the lead on developing these guidelines, working with faculty members across the country to provide input into the process. The proposed guidelines - as well accompanying procedural competency assessment tools - are now ready for review and comments.

Between now and June 8, 2015, family physician educators will have the opportunity to provide input on these proposed guidelines. The guidelines will then be updated based on this feedback and returned to CAFM for final approval.

CAFM is encouraging broad adoption of these guidelines and tools in order to enhance both the skills and credibility of family medicine residency graduates.

Please review and comment on these guidelines before June 8.

Osteopathic Recognition for ACGME Programs

The ACGME will provide Osteopathic Recognition for ACGME accredited graduate medical education programs providing requisite training in the Osteopathic Principles and Practice.

Programs may be deemed to have Osteopathic Recognition after appropriate application, evaluation, and review of the standards outlined below. Programs receiving Osteopathic Recognition may designate the entire program as osteopathic focused or designate a portion of the program as an osteopathic focused track.
